 - -Changes and updates to reflect CACTE Bylaws
 - -Kate Wagner moved to amend the main motion by striking the current language from Article 12, Section 2, which reads, "Notice of the proposed amendments shall be provided to the CACTA Secretary forty-five (45) days prior to the scheduled meeting." and replace it with the language from the CACTE bylaws Article 11, Section 2, which reads, "Notice of the proposed amendments shall be provided to the members no later than thirty (30) days prior to the annual business meeting at which they will be considered."
 - -Seconded by Woody Longmire, amendment passed unanimously
 - -Given the revised amendment to align article 11, section 2 with CACTE bylaws, motion passed unanimously.

ATC Liaison – Linda Van Doren

- -Pickens Technical College:
 - -Pickens has been rated One of the Top Trade Schools In Denver by Expertise.com
 - -Pickens has also been Rated One of the Best Community Colleges In Colorado by Intelligent.com
 - -Small Business Management opening Tax Prep Help Center for the 5th season
 - -Continuing to increase apprenticeship opportunities for Pickens students
 - -Continuing to work on virtual stackable credential programing through Ed2G
 - -Great first year for Apprenticeship to Teaching (A2T)
 - -Continuing to move forward with plans for a Pickens Transportation Bldg. Architectural drawings are complete. Working on partnerships and funding.
 - -CDLE Registered Apprenticeships up and running and expanding in CNA, Dental, A2T, more to come.
 - -We have tripled our team for Customized Training to meet the demand of Apprenticeships, Short Term Credentials and grant opportunities.
 - -Pickens Cosmetology Occupations Department featured on Channel 2 and Fox 31 News
 - -Great opportunities happening with the Colorado Comeback for upskilling, reskilling, and new skilling.
 - -Pickens is honored to continue to contribute to the economic recovery initiative in Colorado.
- -Technical College of the Rockies in Montrose.
 - -Realized an 8% increase in enrollment compared to last year
 - -Launched the Construction Trades program
 - -Expanded the Allied Health Program regionally, capitalizing upon a hybrid approach to our geographically isolated serviced areas
 - -Securing articulation agreements with Western Colorado Community -College/Colorado Mesa University and Western Colorado University
 - -Increased participation in FWYS grant by 82%
 - -Hosted on-site tours for over 400 prospective students
 - -Increased First-time Full-Time enrollment by 50% vs 21-22 school year
 - -Added Job Placement Specialist
 - -TCR hosted a two-week CTE career exploration camp for 200 5-8th graders
 - -Welcomed new Director Randal Palmer and Assistant Director CJ Cannell

-Emily Griffith Technical College:

- -EGTC exceeded our accreditation and institutional goals and achieved 82% program completion, 85% placement in-field, and 99% licensure across our programs.
- -EGTC is the fourth largest postsecondary certificate conferrer in the state, following CU, CSU, and Metro, and #10 in credit hours awarded in the state
- -EGTC is running classes at the Mosaic Campus, formerly Johnson & Wales, and the school's fourth campus, serving as a hub for New Americans
- -EGTC continues to grow our apprenticeship division, receiving two significant grants that have allowed us to expand services and increase staffing. We have tripled our staff to support our

apprenticeship partners, launched several new apprenticeship programs, and our Dean of Apprenticeship, Kelsey Glass, received an Apprenticeship Champion award by CDLE.

- -EGTC celebrated its 107th anniversary of opening by providing free soup to all students and employees on February 9, continuing a tradition begun by our namesake founder.

• Community College Liaison – Vicki Aycock

- -Productive post-secondary breakout session at CACTA. Discussions included:
 - -Credentialing
 - -Perkins Plans
 - -CIP Codes
 - -Post-secondary Summit (PACE) in summer
- -Reach out to Vicki with requests for additional post-secondary sessions at CACTA and CACTE hoping to expand

Secondary Liaison (rural) – Alyssa Horlick

-A short questionnaire was sent via email on February 2nd to rural CTE school districts. -District contact information was found on the Colorado Gateway, however, it was difficult to determine who the primary

contact person for each school district is. -Currently trying to get a most-updated contact list for rural CTE programs to reach as many programs as we can.

- -Guidance to email Adam.
- -The questionnaire asked school districts to provide a few highlights of their programs, if they had areas of concern, and if there was an interest in meeting for collaboration.
- -28 out of 147 school districts responded to the questionnaire.
- -The majority of responses said there was an interest in having rural CTE meetings for collaboration, either in-person or virtually.
- -Many of the school districts report having issues that are far too common across the country.
 - -Staffing shortages
 - -High turn-over
 - -Unable to get qualified CTE instructors, all while having to wear multiple hats in a small school setting.
 - -It is difficult for small school districts to jump through all of the hoops required by the state to receive CTE funding while trying to do other jobs simultaneously. -Many have had to start over programs after COVID, and are waiting for instructors to be eligible for CTE certification.

-CTE Highlights from the rural school districts:

- -Big Sandy's Industrial Arts program is making high quality furniture and competing at fair.
- -Montezuma-Cortez has a coffee shop and screen printing business run by ACE students and technical theatre program that produces two shows a year and where students run tech for touring concerts, a strong catering program where students go out into the community and cater events, and an art program where students recently hosted a show at one of the local art galleries.
- -Miami-Yoder's greenhouse production class creates a business that focuses on our annual spring plant sale where students grow and manage their plants from seed all the way through to the business side of selling, distribution, and customer service.
- -Healthcare and emergency services for high-demand jobs.
- -Weld RE 5J is opening a new comprehensive high school with 14 CTE state approved pathways and more than 20 Continuing Education opportunities on our campus.
- -Bennett is partnering with several agencies around them to create healthcare and emergency service pathways for high demand jobs.
- -Sargent School district has an amazing Aviation program that is helping students get their private pilot's license by graduation.
- -Many schools have began to adopt student based enterprises by having a school store.
